Thank you for choosing to join us for the 2025 Summer Sanctus California Camp for students having just finished 6th-12th grades. We are looking forward to a great camp, and here are a few things that will help us make the most of our time together.

Summer Sanctus 2025

As anyone knows who has attended a Summer Sanctus camp, our days are full, and we are cheerfully tired by the end of the week. This is because we strive to blend together times of worship, interaction, activities, and fellowship. In addition to our morning and evening times of worship, our teaching sessions will be taught by Bo Cogbill, of Reformation Covenant Church, in Oregon City, Oregon. We will also have additional times for small groups and other opportunities for Q & A, as well as a pastoral panel to address various specific questions. Besides Pastor Cogbill, pastors from Christ Church Santa Clarita and other CREC churches will be present for the teaching and panel discussion.

Registration

Registration and tuition includes room, all meals, and a Summer Sanctus t-shirt. All students must register prior to camp, and all registrations must be received by Friday, June 6th.

Supervision

We will have at least one adult counselor for every six to ten students while at the camp. Student campers will not be allowed to go anywhere or do anything without first checking in with their counselor, and only then may they proceed with adult supervision. Boys and girls will not be allowed to pair off together in seclusion from the rest of the group; doing so will be grounds for immediate dismissal from camp. Every camper is required to be involved in the organized group activities throughout the day.

Discipline Issues

In the best interest of all concerned and to promote a good camp community experience, any camper whose behavior is—in the judgment of the camp leadership—disruptive or unruly, and has not heeded corrective warnings, will have their parents notified of the location and time to come and pick them up. Certain misconduct will be grounds for immediate dismissal from the camp. Instead of providing a long list of rules, we shall expect and encourage all who are present to love God and neighbor (Romans 13:8), conducting themselves in a Christ-like manner.

What to Bring:

Your Bible (not on an electronic device), pen or pencils, notebook, sleeping bag (or bedding for small, twin-sized mattresses), pillow, towels, washcloths, toothbrush, soap, shampoo, other toiletries, flashlight, versatile athletic footwear, sun screen, insect repellant, cool comfortable and modest clothing,* modest swimwear (one-piece only), and nice comfortable clothes for the Wednesday Evening Dance.**

*Modest clothing (no spaghetti straps, modest shorts length -4"+ inseam, modest tightness of clothing. Distressed jeans with moderate holes are ok, as long as the holes are in appropriate locations.)

**Gentlemen should wear a nicer button-up shirt and nicer jeans or slacks.

Ladies should wear modest, church appropriate dresses, and for dresses only, spaghetti straps are allowed. Dresses/skirts should be longer than the girl's fingertips. Also, please make sure your daughters are aware of the "twirl factor."

What Not to Bring:

Students should not bring to camp: mobile phones, iPads, tablets, computers, valuable jewelry, matches/lighters, expensive clothing, any audio or video items, knives, or weapons of any kind. Phones must be left at home or with one of the pastors.

Swimming Pool Rules:

The swimming pool at Forest Home Ojai will be open during free time. The camp will provide lifeguards for these times. Swimwear must be modest or a cover-up will be required (at the discretion of camp staff).

Monday Arrival:

Plan to arrive at the camp at 5pm on Sunday. Upon arrival, campers will be directed to registration where they will receive their cabin assignments. Camp orientations will follow shortly.

Thursday Departure:

We will leave the camp before lunch on Thursday, and as we gather all of our belongings to pack, we will be taking care to leave our cabins and the grounds in a clean and orderly condition. Camp counselors will be guiding, assisting, and assuring that this is done. Parents should plan to pick up their children by 10:00am. Parents are also welcome to join us for singing school and our matins service on Thursday morning at 9:00am.

Medical Care

In the event of accident or injury, we will make efforts to contact the student's parent or guardian. Beyond that, we will take whatever action is necessary to see that the injured camper receives the first aid and medical care they require.

Medications

If a camper requires regular medication, we ask that parents provide detailed instructions (see the Registration Form) for the administration of the medicine, and it will only be taken with the awareness and supervision of a camp counselor.
